Your adventure begins with a visit to Colorado's spectacular Capitol building in the heart of the city. Modeled after our nation's capitol, the dome is leafed with gold and the steps at the front of the building feature an official altitude marker where you can stand and be exactly one "Mile" High! The next stop will take you to The Brown Palace Hotel, which was completed in 1892. The building is a remarkable example of Victorian architecture based

on the Italian Renaissance style and is listed on The National Registry of Historic Places. Your tour winds up with the best part of Downtown Denver, Lower Downtown, or “LoDo” as the locals call it. This beautiful area was once home to the turn-of-the-century “red-light” district and now includes Coors Field (home of the Colorado Rockies), The Pepsi Center (home of the Colorado Avalanche and Denver Nuggets), and Larimer Square, which brims with trendy stores, delectable restaurants and a hopping nightlife.
